1. What is a Cloze Test?

A Cloze Test is a reading comprehension exercise where words are removed from a passage and the candidate must replace them. It tests vocabulary, contextual understanding, grammar, and collocation awareness.

2. Core Strategies

- **First Reading (Skimming):** Read the entire passage quickly before looking at options to grasp the overall tone, tense, and theme.
- **Context Clues:** Look before and after the blank (sentence-level and paragraph-level clues).

- **Elimination Method:** Discard grammatically incorrect or illogical options immediately.

3. Key Grammatical Patterns

- **Prepositions:** Dependent prepositions (e.g., *abide by, accustomed to*).
- **Conjunctions:** Logical connectors (e.g., *however, therefore, moreover, although*).
- **Tense Consistency:** Ensure verbs match the narrative timeline of the surrounding sentences.
- **Articles:** Definite (*the*) vs. Indefinite (*a/an*) based on specificity.

4. Vocabulary Collocations

- **Fixed Phrases:** Words that naturally go together (e.g., *heavy rain* not *strong rain*).
- **Tone Match:** Choose positive words for positive contexts and vice versa.
- **Phrasal Verbs:** Pay close attention to verb-particle combinations.

5. Example Breakdown

Passage: Pollution has (1) severe effects on health. Governments must (2) strict laws.

Blank 1 Options: (a) caused (b) led (c) produced (d) brought

Answer: (a) *Caused severe effects* is a standard collocation.
